- **Rule 29** – In order to declare pass a student must secure 33 % marks in each of the subject studied by him /her subject to the condition that:
  1. He/She secures 33 % marks separately in theory and practical portion
  2. The promotion is also subject to the condition that a minimum of 25% marks should be secured in the comprehensive test i.e. annual
  3. A student will have to obtain the required passing marks in any two of the three languages in order to get promoted

**Note:** While calculating 25 % or 33 % the benefit of fraction will go the credit of the student

- **Result Module –**

The checks in the result modules are as follows:

1. English/Sanskrit/Urdu

a. 25 % of 75 i.e. 18

b. 33 % of 100 i.e. 33

2. Hindi

a. 25 % of 75 (65 + 10 CS) i.e. 18

b. 33 % of 100 i.e. 33

3. Science

a. 25 % of 40 (Comprehensive) i.e. 10

b. 33 % of 60(Th. Total) i.e. 20

c. 33 % of 40(Pract. Total) i.e. 13

d. 33 % of 100 i.e. 33

4. Mathematics/Social Science

a. 25 % of 55(Comprehensive) i.e. 13

b. 33 % of 100 i.e. 33

- **Rule 35** – Grace marks upto maximum of 10 in all shall be awarded to a student to enable him/her to reach the minimum required of 33% of marks in each of the subject provided:
  - A minimum of 25 % of marks is secured in each of the subject at the comprehensive test as per Rule 29
  - Maximum marks to be granted in one subject are 5
  - No grace marks are awarded to students taking compartmental examination

- **Rule 32 – Compartmental Examination**

A student who has appeared in comprehensive exam but is not eligible for promotion to next class is eligible for appearing in the compartmental examination provided:

He/She has secured atleast 20 % marks in 1 or 2 failing subjects i.e. (20 or more out of 100)

OR

Incase the Candidate gets atleast 15 % of marks in two failing subjects (i.e. cases where marks are  $\geq 15$  but  $< 20$ ) and 40 % marks in aggregate in the remaining subjects, he/she is also eligible for appearing in compartmental examination

- **Rule 17 – Medical Cases**

Incase a student is unable to appear in one or more subject on medical grounds in

1. Comprehensive exam: Students are allowed to take the exam in those subjects along with the compartmental students. Rules of compartmental exams will be applicable i.e. student will have to obtain 33 % marks in the examination w/o any grace marks or addition of terminal examination marks.

2. 1<sup>st</sup> Terminal or 2<sup>nd</sup> Terminal exam: Test may be ignored for computation of the Result and marks may be calculated by considering (1<sup>st</sup> Terminal + Comprehensive exam or 2<sup>nd</sup> Terminal + Comprehensive exam)

3. 1<sup>st</sup> Terminal and 2<sup>nd</sup> Terminal both: One test is ignored and considered marks obtained as 0 in another terminal test and result is to be calculated as above

- **Result Module –**

1. In absent cases marks are considered as 0

2. If 1<sup>st</sup> Terminal marks are ignored on the basis of medical, result is calculated out of 90 in subjects in which student has not appeared

3. If 2<sup>nd</sup> Terminal marks are ignored on the basis of medical, result is calculated out of 90 in class 8<sup>th</sup> and 85 in class 9<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>.
