CIRCULAR

Sub: Implementation of Stop Diarrhoea Campaign.

Childhood diarrhoeal disease continues to be a major killer among children. Prevention is the key to diarrhoea management. Main activities for prevention include access to safe drinking water, improved sanitation, hand washing with soap & water, adequate nutrition, good personal and food hygiene and health education about infection prevention. In addition, early treatment with ORS & Zinc plays a critical role early recovery and avoiding deaths through preventive measures.

The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has renamed Diarrhoea Campaign as "STOP Diarrhoea Campaign" with the slogan for the year 2024.

"Diarrhoea ki Roktham, Safai aur ORS se rakhen apna dhyaan" "डायरिया की रोकथाम, सफाई और ओआरएस से रखें अपना ध्यान"

Under this campaign, the activities would be carried over a period of two months vide a phase-wise approach.

The Week Wise Activities Charter for all Govt./Govt. Aided/Private Unaided Recognized Schools is as under: -

Preparatory Phase: 14th June - 30th June 2024

- 1. Ensure cleaning of water tanks for prevention of diarrhea.
- 2. Develop plan for school based activities (quiz/drawing competition) and health education sessions.

Week 1 and 2 (1st July - 14th July 2024)

- 1. Participation at launch event at State/District/Block level on Diarrhoea Management.
- 2. Drive to assess the availability of clean and functional toilets at Schools.
- 3. Drive to assess the availability of functional water storage tanks.

Week 3 to Week 6 (15th July - 16th August 2024)

- 1. Organize poster-making/ Essay/ Quiz competitions on Hand washing, Tree plantation, Save water, clean water, Diarrhoea Management etc.
- 2. Organize Tree Plantation Drive (Green Earth Healthy Life) at School level.

- 3. Train Health and Wellness Ambassadors in Schools on diarrhoea prevention and management and promotion of good hygiene practices.
- 4. Invite a local healthcare professional (Community Health Officers, Staff Nurses, and ANMs) to speak on Diarrhoea Management, Hand Washing during Morning Assembly in the school.
- 5. Organize "बालस्वास्थ्यसंवाद" during Monthly Parent Teacher Meeting (PTM) with focus on Healthy Diet, Safe & clean drinking water, use of toilets, handwashing etc.
- 6. Display posters in school corridors highlighting handwashing and sanitation.
- 7. Conduct role-playing activities and skits at schools to demonstrate proper handwashing techniques and encourage school children to adopt hygienic practices.
- 8. Launch a school-wide "Hygiene Heroes" program, where students pledge to maintain good hygiene practices.

Week 7 to Week 8 (17th August - 31th August 2024)

- 1. Facilitate peer-to-peer learning sessions where older students mentor younger peers on proper handwashing techniques and sanitation practices.
- 2. Visit to nearby Ayushman Aarogya Mandir (AAM) Health and Wellness Centre for health screening.
- 3. Conduct workshops on nutrition and healthy eating habits, emphasizing the role of proper nutrition in preventing diarrheal diseases.
- 4. Award ceremony for Students on Independence Day Best Poster, Best Slogan, Quiz competition etc.

Dear Colleague,

Diarrhoea remains a significant public health concern in the country especially for the vulnerable population and Under-5 children. According to the Sample Registration System (2017-19) of Registrar General of India, diarrhoeal diseases remain one of the leading causes of morbidity and mortality in India, contributing to 5.8% of all deaths among children under five years of age.

- 2) Prevention is the key to diarrhoea management. Main activities for prevention include access to safe drinking water, improved sanitation, hand washing with soap & water, adequate nutrition including exclusive breastfeeding & optimal complementary feeding, good personal and food hygiene, health education about infection prevention and importance of vaccination. In addition, early treatment with ORS & Zinc plays a critical role in early recovery and avoiding deaths through preventive measures.
- 3) In this context, collaborated efforts are required among various line Ministries and Departments to deal with the multifaceted challenges associated with the same. There is a strong need for intersectoral convergence in the implementation of diarrhoea management activities in States/UTs to ensure a comprehensive approach for diarrhoea prevention, treatment and management. By leveraging the expertise and resources of each Department, we can achieve greater impact and better outcome in reducing the burden of childhood diarrhoeal diseases.
- 4) The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has renamed Diarrhoea Campaign as "STOP Diarrhoea Campaign" with the slogan for the year 2024:

"Diarrhoea ki Roktham, Safai aur ORS se rakhen apna dhyaan" "डायरिया की रोकथाम, सफाई और ओआरएस से रखें अपना ध्यान"

a) Under this campaign, the activities would be carried over a period of two months vide a phase-wise approach with focus on co-packaging of ORS & Zinc with intensified Information, use of clean drinking water, Education and Communication (IEC)/Social Behaviour Change Communication (SBCC) campaign in collaboration with all stakeholders.

- b) We encourage States/UTs to establish mechanisms for intersectoral coordination and collaboration at the State and District levels during the preparatory phase from 14th June to 30th June before the peak incidence of diarrhoea to ensure seamless implementation of diarrhoea management activities. This may involve programme implementation plan, development of communication strategy (IEC, SBCC etc.), monitoring and review mechanism, formation of interdepartmental task forces and capacity building activities (Annexure I).
- c) We urge you to prioritize actions in your respective States/UTs during the campaign period (1st July - 31st August, 2024) covering the peak season for diarrhoea as per the detailed roadmap enlisting week-wise activities covering aspects of PPT - Protect, Prevent and Treat Strategy. These activities will be carried out in health facilities, community, schools and Anganwadi Centres by respective functionaries in coordination to have maximum impact and coverage till the last mile (Annexure II).
- Together, let us intensify our efforts to combat diarrhoeal diseases and 5) improve the health and well-being of our children. We look forward to your active participation and support in this endeavour.

Week Wise Activities Charter for Participating Ministries

Preparatory Phase: 14th June - 30th June 2024

Health and Family Welfare

- 1. Establishment of Intersectoral Task Force under Department of Health and Family Welfare
- 2. Ensure healthcare facilities are stocked with essential supplies such as ORS, zinc tablets, and IV fluids
- 3. Line listing of Under 5 children at the level of "Ayushman Aarogya Mandir Health and Wellness Centre"
- 4. Development of micro-plan (activity wise), communication strategy (IEC, SBCC etc) and monitoring mechanism
- 5. Capacity building of all stakeholders on STOP Diarrhoea Campaign activities

Women and Child Development

- 1. Conduct Sensitization workshop for District and Block officials on Diarrhoea Management (physical/virtual mode)
- 2. List out the Under 5 children (enrolled at Anganwadi Centres) affected with diarrhoea during last 3-4 months
- 3. Coordination with health department for ORS and Zinc stock for ORT corner at Anganwadi Centre

Drinking Water and Sanitation

- 1. Drive to assess the availability of clean and functional toilets at Anganwadi Centres, Schools, health care facilities and in community toilets
- 2. Development of plan to assess water testing and ensuring availability of 24x7 water facility at Anganwadi Centres, Schools, health care facilities and in community toilets

Urban Development

- 1. Special cleanliness drive Plan and conduct special cleanliness drives to prevent open garbage dumping, clearing of garbage vulnerable points, elimination of stagnant water and drains, drain desilting, special focus on market places, food vending zones, urban slums/informal settlements etc. Plan for intensive drives under Swachh Bharat Mission.
- **2. Collection and transportation of waste-** Plan for seamless collection and transportation of waste on a daily basis to waste processing plants. Special planning to be done to manage the facilities in the event of high rainfall.
- 3. Regular cleaning of all community and public toilets planning and conducting meticulous drives of cleaning and maintenance of public and community toilets especially in high-risk zones in urban slums and informal settlements. Focus to be given to availability of water and handwashing facilities.

- **4. Focus on children-** Plan and ensuring for ensuring clean and functional toilets along with safe drinking water in all Anganwadi Centres, schools, residential and sports hostels. Any required repair & maintenance must be done urgently.
- **5. Adequate sampling of water quality-**Development of plan for collection of adequate sampling for water quality testing
- **6. Supply of safe drinking water and maintenance of water works-** Planning for uninterrupted supply of clean water in all cities, required repair and maintenance of water works, cleaning and maintenance of overhead water tanks and related infrastructure, proper functioning of STPs for water recycling etc. in convergence with AMRUT.
- 7. Rapid assessments to identify high-risk areas- Arrangements are to be put in place for diarrhoea outbreaks, other water-borne, vector-borne diseases and prioritize interventions.
- **8. Planning for IEC and door to door mobilization-** This may be done in collaboration with other stakeholders for handwashing, non-littering, cleanliness, etc. with adequate publicity to emergency numbers.
- **9. Protect Prevent Treat (PPT) Strategy-** Using the preparatory phase from 14th June to 30th June to galvanize all resources to intensify cleanliness drives and maintain all activities from 1st July to 31 August on the principles of PPT-Protect, Prevent and Treat Strategy for diarrhoea prevention as well as vector borne disease control.
- 10. Coordination and Monitoring- Integrate these activities with the existing systems of inter-departmental coordination for pre-monsoon preparedness and disease management during monsoon. Close coordination, regular monitoring, levy of penalties wherever necessary and immediate corrective action to be carried out.

Rural Development

- 1. Participate in planning and coordination meetings organized by Department of Health
- 2. Identify high risk pockets/ areas with diarrhoea outbreak in last 1 year based on data from Department of Health
- 3. Issue communication to Districts and organize orientation meeting on STOP Diarrhoea Campaign 2024

Education

- 1. Ensure cleaning of water tanks for prevention of diarrhoea
- 2. Develop plan for school based activities (quiz/ drawing competition) and health education sessions

Annexure II

Week 1 and 2 (1 July - 14 July 2024) Health and Family Welfare

- 1. Launch of Diarrhoea Campaign by Chief Minister/ Health Minister of Respective State/ UT
- 2. Implementation of Micro-plan (activity wise), communication strategy (IEC, SBCC etc) and monitoring mechanism
- 3. Conduct Sensitization Workshop (physical/ virtual mode)

- 2. Arrange for water quality testing in the Anganwadi, School, health care facilities and Community Centres established at village level
- 3. Trains local communities, organizations, and government officials on water management, sanitation, and hygiene promotion

Urban Development

- 1. Launch event- Participation at launch event at State/ District/ Block level on Diarrhoea Management
- 2. **Cleanliness drives-** Conduct cleanliness drives to ensure visibly higher order of cleanliness in all parts of the city especially the garbage vulnerable areas.
- 3. Continued Action- Continue action all points listed in the preparatory phase.
- 4. **Training-** Train local communities, organizations, and government officials on water management, sanitation, and hygiene promotion.
- 5. **Sanitation Workers-** Take special steps for awareness, care and facilities of all sanitation workers.

6. **Hygiene and sanitation awareness-**P artner with local NGOs, community groups, and private sector organizations to reinforce hygiene and sanitation messages

- 8. Educating families at OPD wards, Nutrition Rehabilitation Centres on the symptoms of diarrhoea, the need for prompt reporting to nearby health facility/ ASHA and preventive measures
- 9. Launch a virtual series of workshops on proper handwashing techniques, safe water storage, and sanitation practices
- 10. Deploy special teams to underserved areas to provide access to diarrhea treatment and preventive services
- 11. Establish referral mechanisms between Anganwadi centers and nearby health facilities for children with severe diarrhea symptoms or complications
- 12. Mid Campaign review at all level (Block/District/State)

Women and Child Development

- 1. Host community meetings with pregnant women and lactating mothers at Anganwadi centers to discuss common misconceptions about diarrhea and address questions or concerns raised by caregivers
- 2. Organize hands-on workshops for caregivers on preparing and administering ORS at home, emphasizing the importance of early intervention in managing diarrhea
- 3. Partner with nearby Ayushman Aarogya Mandir (AAM) Health and Wellness Centre and local community organizations to organize community-wide events, such as health fairs or Morning Walk (*Prabhat Pheri*) to promote of early detection of diarrhea
- 4. Support in role-playing activities and skits at community level to demonstrate proper handwashing techniques and encourage to adopt hygienic practices
- 5. Integrate diarrhea management education into daily activities at Anganwadi centers, such as storytelling sessions and interactive games for children

6. Establish a system for reporting diarrhea cases among children attending Anganwadi centers for tracking treatment compliance and follow-up care through health facility

Drinking Water and Sanitation

- 1. Establish and strengthen VWSCs to manage local water resources and sanitation facilities, ensuring community involvement in maintaining hygiene standards

- 5. Collect data on campaign reach, impact, and behavior change through surveys, interviews, and health facility records
- 6. Documentation of success stories / innovative practices on Diarrhoea Management
- 7. Demonstrate breast milk expression techniques using manual or electric breast pumps at post-natal wards
- 8. Collection and analyze campaign data to identify areas for improvement and develop recommendations for future diarrhea management campaign

Women and Child Development

- 1. Conduct home visits for follow-up care and monitoring of children recovering from diarrhea episodes
- 2. Organize cooking demonstrations showcasing nutritious meals for breastfeeding mothers
- 3. Provide the guidance to lactating mothers on the importance of hydration, balanced diet and adequate calorie intake
- 4. Organize peer support groups meeting where mothers can share successes and challenges related to breastfeeding
- 5. Provide information on introducing complementary foods along with continuing breastfeeding after 6 months
- 6. Conduct regular monitoring visits and field inspections to assess the coverage of campaign interventions
