CIRCULAR

Sub: <u>Second Cycle of Non-Plan Admissions to Classes X and XII through Common Admission Test for the Session 2025-26.</u>

First cycle of Non Plan Admission to Classes X and XII for the session 2025-26 was conducted vide Circular No. DE.23(363)/Sch.Br./2025/259 dated 11-03-2025. Many parents are still approaching the offices of Directorate of Education for admission of their wards to Classes X and XII in schools under Directorate of Education.

In this regard, it has been decided that one more chance may be given to all such students who could not apply in response to the above mentioned Circular.

Criteria for Admission:

a. For class XII: The applicant must have passed class XI from a recognised school as a regular student during 2024-25 with desired subjects. Moreover, he/she must have obtained the minimum marks in class X required for the stream opted by the applicant, as per given table:

- ➤ Students who have passed their Secondary Examination (Class X) from NIOS with 55% marks or above in aggregate of 5 main subjects are eligible for admission in Humanities without Skill Subjects while others are eligible for Humanities with Skill Subjects.
- ➤ Relaxation of 5% marks in any one of the three subjects mentioned for admission in a particular stream of class XII is to be given in respect of candidates belonging to the categories SC/ST/Minorities/OBC (Non Creamy Layer)/Kashmiri Migrants and those students having I/II/III positions in National Games.
- > For Specially Abled Students, relaxation of 5% marks in all subjects mentioned for admission in particular stream of class XII is to be given.
- b. For class X: The applicant must have passed class IX from a recognised school as a regular student during 2024-25.

Guidelines for Admissions:

All the Heads of the Govt. Schools are hereby directed to adhere to the following guidelines for admission to classes X & XII for the Academic Session 2025-26.

- 1. Admission will be allowed to children residing in Delhi only.
- 2. Students will be admitted in Govt. Schools under Directorate of Education except RPVVs, SoSEs and SoEs.
- Children/Parents seeking admission to class X / XII may fill the attached registration form (Annex-A) along with Admit Card (Annex-B) and submit it in any school nearer to their residence. A proper acknowledgement of receipt should be provided to the applicant/parents.
- 4. DDEs (District) will fix the Nodal Centre(s) and depute Nodal Incharge(s) for the Common Admission Test-II (CAT-II) 2025-26.
- 5. The Heads of the schools will forward all the applications to the concerned DDE (Distt.) / Nodal Incharge by 24-07-25 for issue of admit cards. Before forwarding the applications to the concerned DDE (District) / Nodal Incharge, HoS will ensure that all applicants fulfill the eligibility criteria for admission to Class X/XII.
- 6. The Heads of the Schools will also submit a consolidated report of registered applicants in the following format:

7. Age Criteria for admission in these classes must be followed as per Circular No.DE.23(363)/Sch.Br./2016/1553 dated 19-09-2016 and F.265/DDE(IEDSS)/Admn.Cell/2017-18/458-470 dated 13-05-2022.

However, the regular students who have passed previous class during 2024-25 from any Recognised Unaided Schools of Directorate of Education or local bodies of Delhi and having a valid SLC & mark sheet will be exempted from applicability of age appropriate criteria.

In addition to this, Director of Education at her discretion may provide relaxation in upper age limit to any deserving student (not covered under existing provisions) on grounds such as disruption of studies due to death of either of the parents, prolonged illness of either of the parents/child or any trauma faced by the student. In such cases parents of the students are required to apply on the attached format (Annex-C) to the Head of the school nearer to his/her residence along with supporting documents related to the grounds under which relief has been sought. **Head of that school, after**



recording his/her comments regarding suitability for age relaxation will forward the case to the concerned DDE (Zone) along with all the relevant documents including application of the applicant. After examination, if case is found fit for age relaxation only then it be forwarded to School Branch through concerned district clearly recording recommendations of the DDE (Zone). Such applicants may be allowed to appear in the Common Admission Tests but their admission will be confirmed only after grant of age relaxation by Director Education.

Heads of the schools are hereby directed to counsel/guide students, whose application is not found fit for age relaxation, to get admission in NIOS.

- 8. The DDE (District) will issue admit cards (as per attached format) only to the eligible student (as per above mentioned eligibility criteria) after scrutinizing all the applications submitted by Heads of Schools. Photograph of the applicant pasted on Admit Card should be attested by the concerned DDE (Distt.) / Nodal Incharge.
- 9. The admit cards to all the eligible applicants will be distributed on 30-07-2025 (Wednesday) in the schools where the applicants have registered themselves. So, all the DDE (District)/ Nodal Incharges are hereby requested to direct concerned Heads of the Schools under their jurisdiction to collect duly signed Admit Cards from the office of the concerned DDE (District) / Nodal Incharge latest by 29-07-25.
- 10. The Test Paper for CAT-II will comprise Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs). The candidates will provide answers in the Test Booklet itself.
- 11. Test Paper for CAT-II will be provided centrally by Examination Branch.
- 12. For smooth conduct of test, following directions are to be complied with:
 - ➤ For Class X Question Booklet will consist of five subjects: English (20 marks), Hindi (20 marks), Science (20 marks), Social Science (20 marks) & Maths (20 marks).
 - ➤ For Class XII Subject Wise Question Booklet will be provided to the applicant. Test will be conducted stream wise in the following subjects:
 - ✓ For Commerce Stream: English (25 marks), Maths (25 marks),
 Accountancy (25 marks) & Economics (25 marks).

Note: For Commerce without Maths, Maths will not be considered.

✓ For Science Stream: English (25 marks), Maths (25 marks), Physics (25 marks), Biology (25 marks) & Chemistry (25 marks).

Note: For Science without Maths, Maths will not be considered. For Science without Biology, Biology will not be considered.

✓ For Humanities Stream: English (25 marks), Hindi (25 marks), Pol. Science (25 marks), Economics (25 marks), History (25 marks) & Geography (25 marks).

Note: For class XII, it is mandatory to attempt any one language along with other three elective subjects.

- Student will be declared pass in CAT-II only if he/she secures minimum 33% marks in each of the subjects separately as well as in aggregate.
- Applicants are advised to carry any photo ID card e.g. Aadhaar Card, Voter ID Card, School ID Card issued by previous school etc. in the examination centre for their identification.
- > Heads of Schools are directed to disseminate this information to all the candidates and their parents at the time of submission of the application forms.
- 13. Result of the Common Admission Test for Classes X and XII will be declared on 06-08-2025 (Wednesday) at 12:00 Noon and will be displayed in District Office. The same will also be forwarded to all the concerned Heads of Schools by the DDE (Distt.) office.
- 14. The school will be allotted by the concerned DDE (District) as per vacancy/availability of subject combination in the school and residence of the applicant.
- 15. It has been noticed that some invalid combination of subjects is being offered to the students which is creating problem at CBSE/University level. All Head of schools are directed to offer those subjects which are in line with CBSE Guidelines as well as applicable at university level. In case of any query, the HoS may contact CBSE for clarification.
- 16. Concerned HoS will process & submit the files along with countersigned copies of documents for Class X & Class XII **separately** to concerned DDE (District) for approval and generation of Student ID.
- 17. The file must contain the details on the note sheet as per the following format:

CIRCULAR

Sub: Age Criteria for Non-Plan Admissions in Govt. Schools.

Section 4 of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act 2009 says, "Where a child above six years of age has not been admitted to any school or though admitted, could not complete his or her elementary education, then, he or she shall be admitted in a class appropriate to his or her age". The concept of age appropriateness prescribed by the law up to the completion of elementary education cannot be ignored in subsequent classes as it is required from peer learning and pedagogical point of view as well. Therefore, building upon the "age-class" relation established under the RTE Act, the Directorate of Education has continued with the prescribed age in natural progression for subsequent classes as well. Further, the Directorate also recognizes the fact that the stipulation of age cannot be in a straight jacket form. Hence, a relaxation of 6 months in terms of under and over age is also allowed.

In supersession to circulars No. DE.23(363)/Sch.Br./2014/452 dated 04.04.2014, DE.23(363)/Sch.Br./2016/683 dated 29.04.2016, DE.23(363)/Sch.Br./ 2016/1170 dated 13.07.2016 and DE.23(363)/Sch.Br./2016/1246 dated 01.08.2016 regarding Appropriate Age Criteria for Admission in Govt. Schools under Directorate of Education, all the Heads of Govt. Schools under Directorate of Education are hereby informed that the following criteria is to be followed for **Non Plan Admission** in Govt. Schools:

The age criteria for class KG to XII will be as mentioned below:-

Class	Appropriate Age as on 31 st March of the year					
KG	The age of child should be 4+ but less than 5 years					
I	The age of child should be 5+ but less than 6 years					
II	The age of child should be 6+ but less than 7 years					
Ш	The age of child should be 7+ but less than 8 years					
IV .	The age of child should be 8+ but less than 9 years					
V	The age of child should be 9+ but less than 10 years					
VI	The age of child should be 10+ but less than 12 years					
VII	The age of child should be 11+ but less than 13 years					
VIII	The age of child should be 12+ but less than14 years					
IX	The age of child should be 13+ but less than 15 years					
X	The age of child should be 14+ but less than 16 years					
ΧI	The age of child should be 15+ but less than 17 years					
XII	The age of child should be 16+ but less than 18 years					

- In addition to the above Table, further age relaxation is being granted at the level of Heads
 of Schools in the maximum as well as minimum age for 1 month for classes KG to V level as
 on 31st March of the year.
- Simultaneously, age relaxation is also being granted at the level of Heads of Schools in maximum as well as minimum age for 6 months as on 31st March of the year to all students seeking admission from class VI to X and XII in all the Govt. Schools under Directorate of Education.

However, for class XI in addition to the above table, relaxation shall be granted in maximum and minimum age for one year as on 31st March of the year to those students seeking admission in class XI in the Govt. Schools under Directorate of Education, who have passed class X from CBSE or equivalent Board and there is no gap year.

Illustration:

A student who has completed 14 years of age on 31st March of the year and has passed Class X from CBSE or an equivalent Board may be granted admission in Class XI after allowing 1 year age relaxation in the minimum age criteria.

A student who is above 17 years of age but has not completed 18 years of age on 1st April of the year and has passed Class X from CBSE or an equivalent Board may be granted admission in Class XI after allowing 1 year age relaxation in the maximum age criteria.

- The above age criteria is not applicable to Plan Admissions and the existing students of Government Schools.
- The child who is below 14 years of age and have an SLC of a class lower than his age
 appropriate class may be enrolled in Special Training Centres (STC) and then brought to his
 age appropriate class. This provision is intended to mainstream all out of school children,
 including those who due to extreme learning deficiencies cannot be admitted to age
 appropriate classes.
- The Directorate of Education is going to introduce class IX in Patrachar Vidyalaya from next academic session i.e. 2017-18 for students who do not meet the appropriate age criteria. In case of a student who is at least 13 years old as on 31st March of the year when seeking admission, there will be no upper age bar and neither the School leaving certificate nor class VIII pass certificate is required for admission.
- Patrachar Vidyalaya is already functional for classes X to XII. The child should be at least 14 years of age as on 31st March of the year of seeking admission in Class X. Here again, there is no upper age bar and no requirement for school leaving certificate nor class VIII pass certificate.

ORDER

Directorate of Education (DoE) is committed to provide Inclusive Education and need based educational supports to Children with Disabilities (CwDs)/Children with Special Needs (CWSN) in its schools & recognizes the importance of creating enabling mechanisms for providing same opportunities of obtaining quality education as any other child studying in schools of Delhi.

In supervision of all previous orders, the revised instructions to enable CwDs/CWSN in getting admission as provided in RTE Act & RPWD Act 2016 are given as under:

- 1. Head of Schools of all school managements shall ensure that any child is not denied admission in a school on the ground of disability or severity of disability.
- 2. If a child seeking admission in a Govt./Govt. Aided school, lacks requisite documents, the HoS shall admit the child provisionally and provide time duration of maximum 03 (three) months for the child/parent to submit the said document/s after obtaining an undertaking.
- 3. Heads of schools are directed to ensure that CwDs/CWSN is not denied admission in schools only because of their age. Age relaxation given by HoS for admission of CwDs/CWSN shall be 04 years in upper age from class Nursery to Class XII in addition the to relaxation given School by Branch vide No.DE.23(363)/Sch.Br./2016/1553 dated 19.09.2016. Even after getting the age relaxation, if the child is over age and s/he requests for additional relaxation with regard to admission, then the DDE (District) as a Nodal officer shall forward such case to IEB (HQ).
- 4. In all Govt./Govt. Aided schools, if a situation arises wherein the strength of students in a pre-primary/primary class reaches the maximum capacity in a particular section & a CwD/CWSN whishes to take admission, then the HoS shall submit the proposal to concerned DDE (District) for obtaining permission to allow admission for 02 CwDs/CWSN and same shall be considered by DDE (District) at their own level for 02 CwDs per section in a class at entry level as well as at higher classes in a academic year by ensuring appropriate infrastructure and facilities. If any admission case requires CBSE involvement, then the concerned HoS shall pursue CBSE but admission shall not be denied on the ground of disability or severity of disability.
- 5. An out-of-school child with disability who is identified under Home Based Education programme from time to time (as provided in RTE Amendment Act 2012) and who is otherwise eligible for all relaxations regarding admission shall not be denied admission in any Govt. & Govt. Aided school of their choice.
- 6. Heads of Schools shall not deny admission to CwDs/CWSN just on the ground that school doesn't have services of Special Educator and other facilities as provided in RTE Act & RPwD Act 2016.

For getting admission in Govt. & Govt. Aided schools, parents/guardians of CwDs/CWSN shall apply through online/offline mode only as per Departmental

guidelines for admitting their ward. If a parent/guardian of CwD/CWSN is unable to apply for admission within prescribed time period through online/offline mode, even then the Child with disability shall not be denied admission. HoS shall process their admission application and forward it to DDE (Districts) and the latter shall allow admission at their own level in the line of above-said instructions.

In this regard, all HoSs are hereby directed to comply with the above-said instructions in true letter and spirit failing which strict disciplinary action will be taken against them in accordance with the provisions of Section 89 of the RPWD Act, 2016.

Further, DDE (Districts) being Nodal Officers to deal with all matters related to admission of children with disabilities, shall ensure proper implementation of above instructions and allow relaxations as provided in above paras at their own level & monitor the same during their regular visits of schools for effective Inclusive Education of CwDs, in pursuance of the directions of Sections 16 (i) & 31 (1) of the RPwD, Act 2016.

CIRCULAR

Sub: Age Criteria for Non-Plan Admissions in Govt. Schools.

Section 4 of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act 2009 says, "Where a child above six years of age has not been admitted to any school or though admitted, could not complete his or her elementary education, then, he or she shall be admitted in a class appropriate to his or her age". The concept of age appropriateness prescribed by the law up to the completion of elementary education cannot be ignored in subsequent classes as it is required from peer learning and pedagogical point of view as well. Therefore, building upon the "age-class" relation established under the RTE Act, the Directorate of Education has continued with the prescribed age in natural progression for subsequent classes as well. Further, the Directorate also recognizes the fact that the stipulation of age cannot be in a straight jacket form. Hence, a relaxation of 6 months in terms of under and over age is also allowed.

In supersession to circulars No. DE.23(363)/Sch.Br./2014/452 dated 04.04.2014, DE.23(363)/Sch.Br./2016/683 dated 29.04.2016, DE.23(363)/Sch.Br./ 2016/1170 dated 13.07.2016 and DE.23(363)/Sch.Br./2016/1246 dated 01.08.2016 regarding Appropriate Age Criteria for Admission in Govt. Schools under Directorate of Education, all the Heads of Govt. Schools under Directorate of Education are hereby informed that the following criteria is to be followed for **Non Plan Admission** in Govt. Schools:

The age criteria for class KG to XII will be as mentioned below:-

Class	Appropriate Age as on 31 st March of the year					
KG	The age of child should be 4+ but less than 5 years					
I	The age of child should be 5+ but less than 6 years					
II	The age of child should be 6+ but less than 7 years					
Ш	The age of child should be 7+ but less than 8 years					
IV .	The age of child should be 8+ but less than 9 years					
V	The age of child should be 9+ but less than 10 years					
VI	The age of child should be 10+ but less than 12 years					
VII	The age of child should be 11+ but less than 13 years					
VIII	The age of child should be 12+ but less than14 years					
IX	The age of child should be 13+ but less than 15 years					
X	The age of child should be 14+ but less than 16 years					
ΧI	The age of child should be 15+ but less than 17 years					
XII	The age of child should be 16+ but less than 18 years					

- In addition to the above Table, further age relaxation is being granted at the level of Heads
 of Schools in the maximum as well as minimum age for 1 month for classes KG to V level as
 on 31st March of the year.
- Simultaneously, age relaxation is also being granted at the level of Heads of Schools in maximum as well as minimum age for 6 months as on 31st March of the year to all students seeking admission from class VI to X and XII in all the Govt. Schools under Directorate of Education.

However, for class XI in addition to the above table, relaxation shall be granted in maximum and minimum age for one year as on 31st March of the year to those students seeking admission in class XI in the Govt. Schools under Directorate of Education, who have passed class X from CBSE or equivalent Board and there is no gap year.

Illustration:

A student who has completed 14 years of age on 31st March of the year and has passed Class X from CBSE or an equivalent Board may be granted admission in Class XI after allowing 1 year age relaxation in the minimum age criteria.

A student who is above 17 years of age but has not completed 18 years of age on 1st April of the year and has passed Class X from CBSE or an equivalent Board may be granted admission in Class XI after allowing 1 year age relaxation in the maximum age criteria.

- The above age criteria is not applicable to Plan Admissions and the existing students of Government Schools.
- The child who is below 14 years of age and have an SLC of a class lower than his age
 appropriate class may be enrolled in Special Training Centres (STC) and then brought to his
 age appropriate class. This provision is intended to mainstream all out of school children,
 including those who due to extreme learning deficiencies cannot be admitted to age
 appropriate classes.
- The Directorate of Education is going to introduce class IX in Patrachar Vidyalaya from next academic session i.e. 2017-18 for students who do not meet the appropriate age criteria. In case of a student who is at least 13 years old as on 31st March of the year when seeking admission, there will be no upper age bar and neither the School leaving certificate nor class VIII pass certificate is required for admission.
- Patrachar Vidyalaya is already functional for classes X to XII. The child should be at least 14 years of age as on 31st March of the year of seeking admission in Class X. Here again, there is no upper age bar and no requirement for school leaving certificate nor class VIII pass certificate.

This issues with the prior approval of the Competent Authority.
