#### Sub: Prevention and Elimination of Malaria.

This is in furtherance of Circular No. DE.23 (386)/SchBr/SHP/2024/22-27 dated:15.04.2025, regarding Prevention and Control of Vector Borne Diseases (Dengue, Chikungunya and Malaria).

In this connection, all RDEs, DDE (Districts and Zones)Head Quarters/Heads of all branches of DoE/Principals/HoS's of Govt./Govt. Aided/Private Unaided Recognized Schools of Delhi are requested to follow the below mentioned activities for prevention and eradication of Malaria.

Government of India (GoI) has fixed the year 2030 as target for eradication of Malaria. **The month of June is observed as Anti-Malaria Month (AMM) every year** prior to the onset of transmission season of Malaria. The objective of observing the AMM before the onset of monsoon, is to enhance community awareness, participation and motivation of all stakeholders.

Following are some of the suggested activities in addition to the previously communicated activities which may be observed during the AMM:

- Office/Department/organizations/institutes etc. may check their premises for mosquito breeding and water stagnation.
- Display of DO's and Don'ts at prominent places in Department/Office/ Institute etc. (enclosed as annexure A)
- Sensitization of staff about Vector Borne Diseases and dissemination of messages through social media.
- Awareness talks/health talks/interpersonal communication may be organized in offices, institutions on prevention and control of Malaria.

This issues with the prior approval of Competent Authority.
